- ❖ Her problem: This is known by a few other experts but not outside.
- ❖ And the last thing she can imagine is trying to find options for industrial use of her knowledge



Introducing Thierry



- ❖ Thierry is working as Business Developer for a company building software for text analytics
- ❖ Clients are telling him: „Your system is great. But do you have a plugin also for my industry?“
- ❖ Thierry’s company is rushing to cover various industry sectors. But there are so many!
- ❖ Problem: How can Thierry make his platform more attractive to new client with the limited resources his company has?



- ❖ Andy (industry): „With the proper support for my domain, I could well benefit from this software ... but it seems they currently just don't offer the respective components.
- ❖ Julie (academic expert): „I wouldn't mind seeing my thesaurus being used more widely (and perhaps even generating revenues) ... but I don't have time to do ‚sales‘.
- ❖ Thierry: It was quite a bit of work to offer appropriate analysis for sector A and B ... redoing that also for C, D, E and F is out of question. We'd need to cooperate here ...

A problem that could be solved

- ❖ ... if they could meet, exchange, offer and trade
- ❖ ... if there'd be the proper marketplace

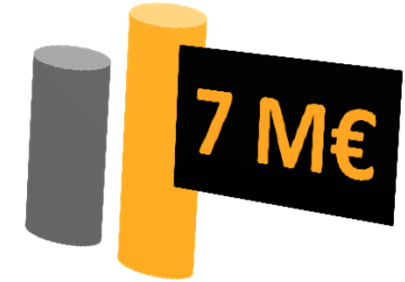
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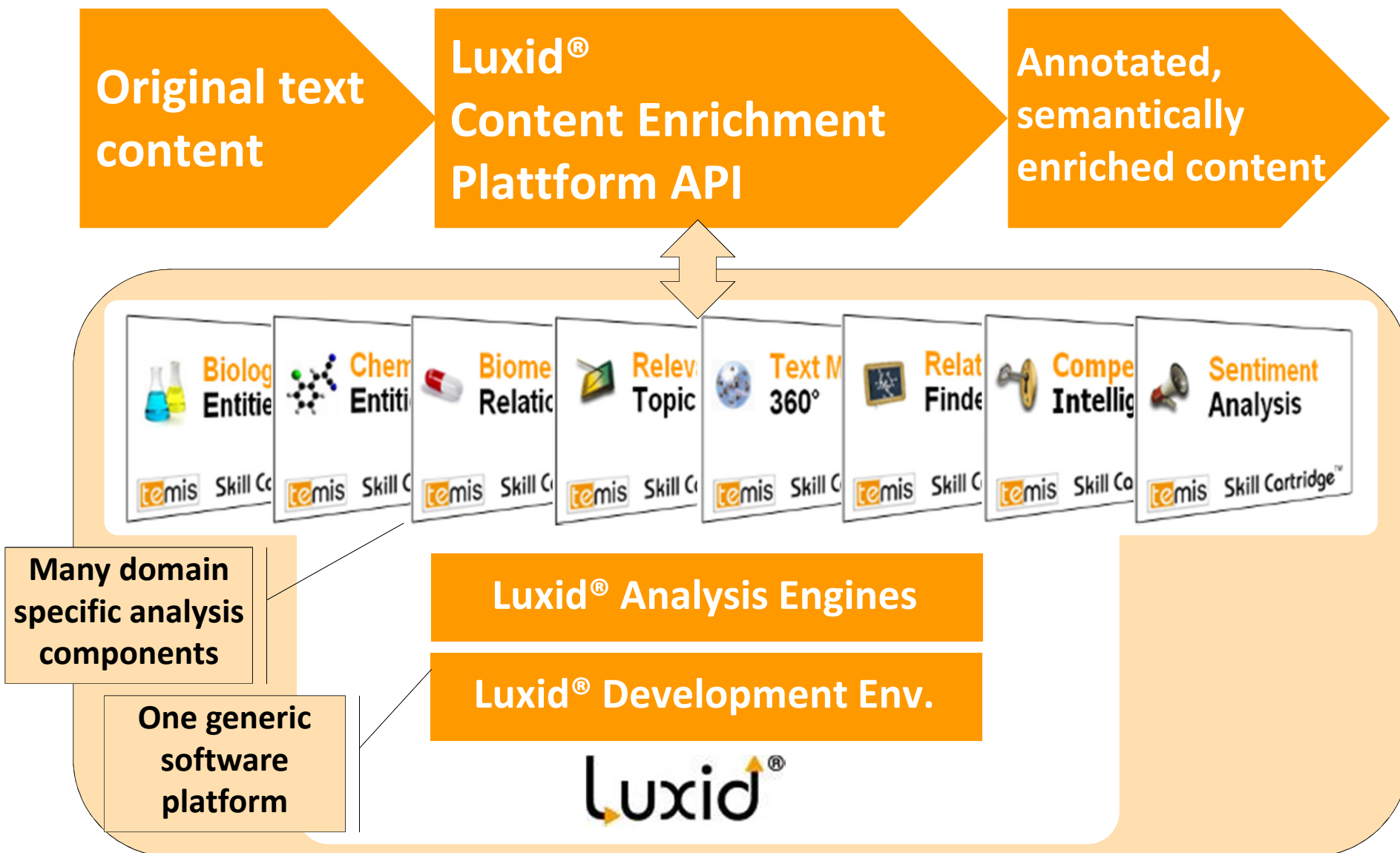

Example: (real-world, in production!)



- ❖ BASF: Needs to automatically annotate scientific literature with proteins and genes (but has no inclination to develop this on their own)
- ❖ Fraunhofer Institute SCAI: Had been working on protein name recognition for a while (but not interested to build up the infrastructure to market, sell and support this)
- ❖ TEMIS: Cooperates with BASF in semantic enrichment of scientific literature (but is not a protein expert)
- ❖ Win-Win-Win situation: Protein-specific plugin from Fraunhofer on the TEMIS platform Luxid deployed at BASF!

A Marketplace for Text Analysis components



- ❖ TEMIS currently setting up a marketplace
- ❖ Supporting the process of turning existing resource into annotation components with appropriate tools and best practises
